Château Greysac is a beautiful mansion **built during the 18th century** that inspires elegance and finesse. For many years it was the property of the late Baron François de Gunzburg; then in 1975 it had been owned by the Agnelli family. **Jean Guyon purchased the estate in 2012 and has brought the property to its prime.** His dedication to the estate and its wines have fostered the continued success of Chateau Greysac – now with over **50 years distribution in the U.S.**

INTEGRITY

Jean Guyon has applied his highly reputable detail-oriented approach, which he became famous for in the interior-decorating world in Paris, to every decision and task he has undertaken. **A complete modernization of the wine making facilities, cellars and replantation of the vineyard were all implemented.**

FAMILY


It was during a visit to the Medoc that Jean Guyon discovered the exceptional terroir. Self-taught, passionate and attentive to every detail, he embarked on a winemaking journey with the simple ambition of **making pleasurable wines for his family and friends.** For the last three decades he has been crafting wines full of authenticity, individuality and finesse.

CURIOSITY

Château Greysac has a culture that **respects the environment** as much as possible. They uphold **traditional viticultural practices** while also embracing new technologies when they provide quality benefits. A minutious daily care regimen is applied to the maintenance and development of the vineyards. Jean Guyon is now the largest landowner in the Medoc.

TERROIR

Located in the **northern part of Médoc**, not far from the Atlantic Ocean and close to the Estuary of the Gironde, the estate is a 180-hectare vineyard that benefits from a microclimate, protected from extreme conditions. The vines are about **70% Merlot**, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Petit Verdot and 5% Cabernet Franc. On gravelly soil known as the **Gunzian gravel**, combined with sand and clay sub-layers.

DID YOU KNOW?

Château Greysac comes in multiple formats – from 375ml, 750ml, 1.5L, 3.0L and 6.0L.

65% Merlot,
29% Cabernet Sauvignon,
3% Cabernet Franc,
3% Petit Verdot

STYLE //

The Château's characteristic style is indeed one of great aromatic finesse, combined with precise, sumptuous fruit flavors that develop in elegance and complexity over time.

This wine is smooth and rounded thanks to the predominance of Merlot grapes and the 12 months oak aging.

CRU BOURGEOIS //

The Cru Bourgeois classification lists some of the châteaux from the Médoc that were not included in the 1855 Classification of Crus Classés.



APPELLATION //

Médoc is effectively a Peninsula that extends 50 miles north-westwards of Bordeaux. The Médoc peninsula is divided into three sections: the Landes du Médoc, the Haut-Médoc, and the Bas-Médoc where Château Greysac is located.


GRAPE VARIETY //

100% Sauvignon Blanc

Sauvignon Blanc is a green-skinned grape variety that originated in the Bordeaux region of France. In cooler climates, like Médoc, the grape has a tendency to produce wines with noticeable acidity tropical, herbaceous hints and floral notes.

STYLE //

The vines average 15 years old and are planted in clay-limestone soil. The wine is vinified in thermo-regulated stainless steel tanks. This wine perfectly balanced between seducing peach and apricot flavors, subtle floral, mineral notes, altogether carried by a refreshing aquiline acidity.



APPELLATION //

Bordeaux Blanc AOC

Bordeaux Blanc makes up a mere 7-8% of all Bordeaux production, but the history of white wine production in the region is very old. In fact, it is the birthplace of Sauvignon Blanc, a grape variety that pre-dates Cabernet Sauvignon! Other allowable white grape varieties in Bordeaux are Semillon, Sauvignon Gris and a very small percentage of Colombard, Folle Blanche, Ugni Blanc and other assorted grapes. The Bordeaux region is a continental climate with strong influence from the Atlantic Ocean.
