CHÂTEAU GRAND VILLAGE

BORDEAUX, FRANCE



The vineyards of Château Grand Village have remained in the hands of the Guinaudeau family since the 17th century and is today the home base for Jacques and Sylvie's family. The 40 acres of Château Grand Village are planted partly to white grape varietals and partly to red grape varietals (approximately 70% Merlot and 30% Bouchet [Cabernet Franc]). The average age of the

vines is approximately 20 years. The estate is located between Fronsac and Bourg. The terroir is made of clay-calcareous soil. Château Grand Village uses the same vineyard farming techniques employed at the Guinaudeau's family-owned famous estate, Château Lafleur in Pomerol which results in a beautifully elegant and balanced wine.

Owned by the Guinaudeau family, Château Grand Village has been writing a new chapter in its story. Wines of Grand Village are vinified with the same approach and philosophy as Château Lafleur, and has become a singular wine – known as a down to earth Bordeaux crafted with the means and in the spirit of a grand cru.

- In 2002, the Guinaudeau family purchased the shares of the estate held by other family members and became the sole proprietors, having had the great luck of vinifying the fruit of this mythic cru since that time together with their three children
- The second half of the 20th Century was a time of improvement in Fronsac's wines, as they attracted attention from further afield than their established European markets. New technology and a change in winemaking philosophy have led to continued progress and the appellation now offers affordable alternatives to the high-priced wines of the Médoc, Pomerol and Saint-Émilion

- 81% Merlot, 19% Bouchet (Cabernet Franc)
- This Chateau uses many of the same vineyard farming techniques employed at Guinaudeau's famous estate, Château Lafleur in Pomerol
- Fronsac is an appellation for red wines based on Merlot, produced in an area in the east of the Bordeaux wine region; It is located close to the northern bank of the Dordogne river, just a few miles to the west of Libourne
- Hand-harvested with double sorting at the vineyard and a third sorting in the cellar
- 12 months barrel ageing (30% new oak, 40% one year old barrels, 30% two year old barrels)
- Harmonious and with great balance, enjoy this wine in its youth, or, with a few years in bottle, it can develop a more refined and mineral tannic spine, which makes the wine really the "Grand Village of Lafleur"
- Very elegant with a nice balance of red fruits and some delicious notes of roasted coffee; Good length

CHÂTEAU GRAND VILLAGE CHÂTEAU GRAND VILLAGE BORDEAUX BLANC

Bordeaux, France

- 74% Sauvignon Blanc, 26% Sémillon
- The Guinaudeau family has been growing vines at Grand Village since the 17th century
- The soils are composed more of sandstone and limestone than clay, giving the vines a certain resistance to hotter weather
- Hand-harvested with double sorting performed at the vineyard
- Eight months barrel aging, including 5 months of gentle lees-stirring
- This has evolved over just a few years into a different wine, showing a complex floral nose and great harmony between tension and texture on the palate
- The finish is very long and elegant; The wine's capacity to age in bottle evolved considerably
