Dried spices, cracked pepper and roasted meat notes scream of Syrah and the Northern Rhône. It's medium to full in body, but with fine tannins and bright acidity, making it remarkably easy to drink. Approachable now, it should still be drinking well through 2030. — J.C.

Features a juicy edge, with bramble and anise notes lining the core of plum, red currant and raspberry fruit. Enticing spice details and a flicker of bay move through the finish. Best from 2015 through 2025. - J.M.



Powerful aromas of blueberry, blackberry, woodsmoke and peppery spices... Energetic flavors of fresh dark berries, black pepper and candied violet, with a hint of olive in the background. Rich yet graceful and focused, with a smoky, floral finish and supple, even tannins. — J.R.
